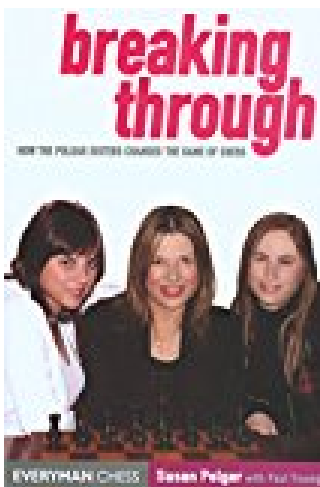

From the Back Cover Breaking through is the inside story of the lives of the famous Polgar sisters. The three sisters, born in Hungary, have taken the chess world by storm over the past two decades. All three achieved grandmaster results in their teens and followed up their early promise with astonishing achievements. In 1989 Sofia scored an incredible 8 1/2/9 in a powerful tournament in Rome; in January 1991 Susan became the first ever woman to achieve the male grandmaster title and in December

1991 the youngest, Judit, broke Bobby Fishcher's record to become the youngest grandmaster ever. Between them, Susan and Judit have occupied the world number one ranking slot for the past 21 years.

Breaking Through charts the lives of all three sisters and witnesses their development from child prodigies through successes in junior events, Olympiads and finally World Championships. Along the way the sisters revolutionized the public perception of chess and broke gender and age barriers. They not only had to defeat top players in competition, they also had to overcome sexism, hypocrisy and resentment arising from their parent's individualistic educational approach. The training methods used by the Polgars are controversial. These methods are fully discussed and the sisters themselves reveal what they think about them.

About the Author Susan Polgar is the eldest of the celebrated Polgar sisters, a 4-time Women's World Champion and a triple Olympic Champion. She created chess history and broke the gender barrier by becoming the first ever woman to earn the highest possible title of Grandmaster. She resides in the US.

Paul Truong is a former chess prodigy and was champion of Vietnam before fleeing his country and eventually reaching America. After many years as a successful businessman, his passion has turned to popularizing chess and helping children to progress in the game. He resides in the US.

Polgar and her two younger sisters, Grandmaster Judit and International Master Sofia, were part of an educational experiment carried out by their father LÁ;szlÁ; PolgÁ;r, who sought to prove that children could make exceptional achievements if trained in a specialized subject from a very early age. move, explaining her thought process, options, mistakes, etc. It's pretty amazing to follow along, even to a chess novice like myself. It's
too bad this level of attention wasn't invested in the rest of the book. There are three Polgar sisters and they are all female chess
phenoms (say that 10 times fast). The ending of Breaking Through tries to make the case that there aren't enough women playing
chess. This (tediously) reminded me of the "not enough girl nerds" argument. Whatev. yow, bill ...more.
