Returning to Marcuse may recall the clash of idealistic exuberance and tragic violence associated with Woodstock, Haight-Ashbury, the Vietnam War, 1968 Democratic Convention, Kent State, and Earth Day, as well as the passionate voices of anti-war and civil rights protesters, environmentalists, feminists, and free love advocates. The New Left was a broad political movement mainly in the 1960s and 1970s consisting of activists in the Western world who campaigned for a broad range of social issues such as civil and political rights, feminism, gay rights, abortion rights, gender roles and drug policy reforms. Some saw the New Left as an oppositional reaction to earlier Marxist and labor union movements for social justice that focused on dialectical materialism and social class, while others who used the term saw the movement as a "Herbert Marcuse Introduction Part 1." "The Essential Marcuse." "The Frankfurt School: From a Failed Revolution to Critical Theory | Tom Nicholas." "Prefaces and Introduction from Eros and Civilization by Herbert Marcuse." Herbert Marcuse appealed to students of the New Left through his emphasis on the power of critical thought and his vision of total human emancipation and a non-repressive civilization. He supported students he felt were subject to the pressures of a commodifying system, and has been regarded as an inspirational intellectual leader.[34] He is also considered among the most influential of the Frankfurt School critical theorists on North American culture, due to his studies on student and counter-cultural movements on the 1960s.[35] The legacy of the 1960s New Left, broad range of leftist activist movements and intellectual currents that arose in western Europe and the U.S. in the late 1950s and 1960s. New Left currents first arose in Europe in response to the perceived moral discredit of Soviet communism following Soviet leader Nikita Khrushchev's "secret speech" in February 1956, which revealed the extent of political repression under Joseph Stalin's leadership. Marcuse's work was part of a broader theoretical trend in which the agency of the working classes of advanced capitalism came to be doubted, although that issue remained controversial within the New Left. Thinkers of the New Left also made groundbreaking contributions to the analysis of culture and communications. The New Left was a term used mainly in the United Kingdom and United States in reference to activists, educators, agitators and others in the 1960s and 1970s who sought to implement a broad range of reforms, in contrast to earlier leftist or Marxist movements that had taken a more vanguardist approach to social justice and focused mostly on labor unionization, and questions of social class.[2]. In the U.S., the "New Left" was associated with the Hippie movement and college campus protest movements. Herbert Marcuse, a philosopher of the New Left, said that "The new radicalism militates against the centralized bureaucratic communist as well as against the semi- democratic liberal organization." Google Scholar. There was some ambivalence as to the status Marcuse assigned to the "new sensibility" and New Left groups-in-revolt in the revolutionary process. On one hand, he argued: "The social agents of revolution" and this is orthodox Marx "are formed only in the process of transformation itself, and one cannot count on a situation in which the revolutionary forces are there ready-made, so to speak, when the revolutionary movement begins" (5L, p. 64).
