Lawrence Washington, a man of character and knowledge, became his guardian. Lawrenceâ€™s wife was also famed for her charm,
grace, and culture. Mostly living in their home in Mount Vernon, George imbibed a lot, not only from them but also from his surroundings.
By the age of 15, George Washington had completed his formal schooling. Thereafter, Lawrence, who had earlier served in the
â€˜Royal Navy,â€™ thought of securing a post for George in the same warfare force. But the proposal was dropped when his mother
objected. Instead, he began his career as a surv When the Revolutionary War was over, General Washington wanted to go home to his
Virginia estate, called Mount Vernon. Joseph Ellis is a historian and prize-winning author who wrote a book called â€œHis Excellency:
George Washington.â€ â€œHe didnâ€™t want to be president.Â As president, George Washington travelled around the country. In
Rhode Island, he wrote to the Hebrew Congregation at Truro. The letter spoke eloquently about the rights of Jews. Mr. Bradburn says
