

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Used in the special education context, physical disability or orthopedic impairment includes severe disabilities that adversely affect educational performance. There is a diverse range of disabilities in this category including such conditions as cerebral palsy, spina bifida, amputations or limb absences, and muscular dystrophy. Competent diagnosticians recognize their personal limitations and seek help from therapists, educators, physicians, nurses, social workers, and others to gather appropriate data. The team generally includes the parents, teachers, medical professionals, and health-related professionals such as a physical therapist. Parents are critical members of the team and should be involved in all educational decisions.

The term includes impairments caused by a congenital anomaly (e. g., clubfoot, absence of some member, etc.), an impairment caused by disease (e. g., poliomyelitis, bone tuberculosis, etc.), and an impairment from any other cause (e. g., cerebral palsy, amputation
